THE PRAYERS AND BIBLE READINGS

COLLECT:

Merciful Lord, cast your bright beams of light upon the Church: that, being enlightened by the teaching of your blessed apostle and evangelist Saint John, we may so walk in the light of your truth that we may at last attain to the light of everlasting life; through Jesus Christ your incarnate Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. **Amen.**

READINGS:

Exodus 33.7-11a,
1 John 1
John 21.19b-end

BIBLE NOTES:

A theme we find running through today's readings is that of intimacy. In the Old Testament reading we learn that Moses is able to speak with God "face to face, as one speaks to a friend". Such intimacy allowed Moses to see the glory of the Lord revealed in his mercy, his grace, and his steadfast love for his people. In the Gospel we meet John, the disciple whom Jesus loved and whose intimacy with Jesus allowed him to grasp the truth about the Word made flesh – the truth to which he testifies in his Gospel. Finally, in the first letter of John we read about our own call to fellowship with the Father and with his Son and with one another – a call to strive for that intimacy which will bring us life in all its fulness.

POST COMMUNION PRAYER:

Grant, O Lord, we pray, that the Word made flesh proclaimed by your apostle John may, by the celebration of these holy mysteries, ever abide and live within us; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Services in Tier 4

As we find ourselves in Tier 4, one important difference from previous lockdowns is that, in Tier 4, public worship is allowed to continue. This, it seems, is because the Government recognises both the huge efforts that have gone into making places of worship safe, and the great importance many people attach to public worship. Accordingly, both State and Church have left it to individual parishes to make the decision about what is right in their context.

Abbots Langley PCC has decided that both our churches, St. Lawrence and the Church of the Ascension, will remain open for public worship, offering our normal range of services on Sunday and throughout the week. Of course, these remain subject to the 'normal' 2020 restrictions: you have to book in with the parish office, keep social distance, wear a mask, not sing, not have wine at communion, not stay for chat and coffee afterwards.... it's church, but not as anyone likes it.

In normal times, vicars say that everybody should come to church all the time. These are not normal times: so if you are especially vul-

nerable to this virus for any reason, you should think very carefully about whether it is actually wise for you to attend. Maybe it is - and perhaps more likely, maybe it is not. Only you can make that decision, but nobody should feel the slightest twinge of guilt about staying away from church services at the moment. If in doubt, don't come.

Remember that the 9.30 service is livestreamed each week on The Sunday Service.Org and on Facebook Live (you don't have to be a member of Facebook to view this), and public worship from elsewhere in the country is also available on BBC radio every day. Maxine and I are happy to bring communion to you at home (whilst observing very strict Covid-safety), and of course are very happy to ring and chat – just be in touch with the parish office for anything you need.

We'll keep the decision to remain open under careful review each week, and of course will always be alert to changes in the guidance from the Government and the Diocese.
