Obediently, they submit to suffering, and wait expectantly for God to act to bring redemption and freedom.

SECOND READING

This early hymn on the humiliation and exaltation of Christ shows how far the church had come in understanding the uniqueness of Jesus even by Paul's time. Sharing God's glory, Christ yet emptied himself to the uttermost and was raised to the height of reverence by the whole created order. This is our example and our hope.

GOSPEL Matthew 27.11-54 Bible page 28

The arrival of Jesus in Jerusalem to the cheering of crowds is a false dawn. They are still thrilled by the signs he has wrought in giving sight to the man blind from birth and raising Lazarus from the dead. In fact not only they, but even Jesus' closest friends will betray and desert him within a few days. The final confrontation between Jesus and

the devil is too much. They don't understand what Jesus is doing for them and for the whole human race when he refuses to bow down to temporal power and betray the love that God sent him to bring to the world.

POST COMMUNION PRAYER:

Lord Jesus Christ, you humbled yourself in taking the form of a servant, and in obedience died on the cross for our salvation: give us the mind to follow you and to proclaim you as Lord and King, to the glory of God the Father. Amen.
