THE PRAYERS AND BIBLE READINGS

Bibles are available in the book rack by the door where you entered.

COLLECT: Almighty God, who made Lawrence a loving servant of your people and a wise steward of the treasures of your Church: fire us with his example to love as he loved and to walk in the way that leads to eternal life; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. Amen.

FIRST READING Tobit 4.5-11 Bible page 4

The book of Tobit is a piece of historical fiction about the sufferings and healing of a pious Jew and his family who lived away from Israel in a Gentile world. It provides important evidence about the religious, intellectual and social life of Jews in the 4th and 3rd centuries BC. This section is about the right use of money. Almsgiving, or in our culture Christian stewardship, was fundamental as a tangible expression of religious belief. It 'delivers from death and keeps you from going into Darkness' (v 10). The more we give away, the less we are ensnared by our possessions.

SECOND READING 2 Corinthians 9.6-10 Bible page 180

Paul teaches the Corinthians that, if they give generously, they will find that they always have enough of everything. This inversion of normal values relies on the idea that God's values are different from ours. From his eternal perspective it makes sense to seek riches in heaven. This may often be at the cost of earthly comfort: giving money is just the beginning.

GOSPEL Matthew 13.44-46 Bible page 14

Here Jesus compares his Kingdom to a treasure of great value – it would be worth giving all one has to possess it. We often read this passage as about the price of Christian commitment: St Lawrence offers an interestingly different perspective. What if we – especially the poor and

the weak – are the treasure, and it is God who gave all that He had to find it?

POST COMMUNION PRAYER:



Laurence Deacon at Rome, Martyr

Laurence was one of the seven deacons at Rome and closely associated with Pope Sixtus II, martyred just a few days before him. His examiners insisted he produce the Church treasures. He promptly did so: assembling all the poor, he is reputed to have said, 'These are the treasures of the Church.' The story of his being put to death on a gridiron is a much later addition to his story. He died on this day in the year 258.
