THE PRAYERS AND BIBLE READINGS

Bibles are available in the book rack by the door where you entered.

COLLECT: Almighty Father, whose Son was revealed in majesty before he suffered death upon the cross: give us grace to perceive his glory, that we may be strengthened to suffer with him and be changed into his likeness, from glory to glory; who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

FIRST READING Exodus 24.12-end Bible page 72

All of today's readings are about God's glory. God's appearance in fire on top of Mount Horeb was awe-inspiring; the people are caught up in an immediate vision of God. And yet the cloud also suggests that God's presence is veiled: the appearance of God as he is is beyond human capacity to conceive or endure. Yet it is this encounter with God, in which God gives his people the law, that is the foundation for the future life of Israel.

SECOND READING 2 Peter 1.16-end Bible page 234

Peter's concern is with true knowledge, about how trustworthy the faith of the church is. He speaks from the experience of having seen the transfiguration, which vision is in harmony with the words of the prophets about the coming of the Messiah in glory.

GOSPEL Matthew 17.1-9 Bible page 17

Malachi had predicted the return of Elijah as a herald of the Messiah. Moses was the great lawgiver, the one through whom God made his covenant with Israel. The appearance of these two figures in glory with Jesus points to his glory; the voice from heaven confirming Jesus as God's Son, the Messiah. Drawing on the Exodus reading and on the tradition of God appearing on mountains, this event once again shows God's awesome majesty.

POST COMMUNION PRAYER: Holy God, we see your glory in the face of Jesus Christ: may we who are partakers at his table reflect his life in word and deed, that all the world may know his power to change and save. This we ask through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**
