THE PRAYERS AND BIBLE READINGS

COLLECT: Almighty God, whose Son revealed in signs and miracles the wonder of your saving presence: renew your people with your heavenly grace and in all our weakness sustain us by your might power; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

BIBLE NOTES: Why choose, for the very first of your miracles, to change water into wine at a wedding? Great news for the couple concerned and their guests, no doubt, but hardly an agenda worthy of the Messiah! But there is much meaning in the miracle. The Bible is full of wedding feasts, often used as an image for the destiny of all things (as, for instance, in today's reading from *Revelation 19*). It's a good image, because it fuses together the elements of joy and celebration with the idea of lives coming together in

ecstatic unity – just like, the great biblical hope holds, one day God and the world will come together in a great union of gladness. The world will become a wedding. And Jesus, according to the Gospels, is the one who will make all this happen: he is the Bridegroom (see *Mark 2:18-20*), and he is the one who will, in the end, usher in the astounding new marriage of heaven and earth to which all ordinary weddings point. Weddings and marriages here and now may run out of steam, run out of wine, run out of love: the Gospel is that they, like everything else, are going to swept up in an abundance of joy of which they can barely now conceive.

POST COMMUNION PRAYER: Almighty Father, whose Son our Saviour Jesus Christ is the light of the world: may your people, illumined by your word and sacraments, shine with the radiance of his glory, that he may be known, worshiped, and obeyed to the end of the earth; for he is alive and reigns, now and forever **Amen.**

Bishops Golden Rules

Golden Rule One

Each one of us can think about how we can protect and support our neighbours. So much of the public rhetoric is sowing fear about the danger of other people. So, taking all the official precautions, offer help and reassurance to others – and don't demonise anyone or any group.

Golden Rule Two

Think about who may be suffering more than me. For those of us who are healthy there is much less to worry about but the elderly, the housebound and those with chronic health conditions may be very anxious. How about each church undertaking an audit of all the vulnerable people they know and sharing out the responsibility to phone them each day. There's nothing like a friendly voice to offer solace when someone is worried. A smile can bring cheer, even on the phone. If you visit, follow all the official precautions or don't go.

Golden Rule Three

Don't give into panic and start hoarding food. There is plenty to go around, so practise the Christian discipline of sharing. Ask your neighbours what they need and do your best to help them get it. If you are self-isolating you will of course need some supplies.

Golden Rule Four

Live today to the full. None of us ever know what the future holds. In the Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 6. 25 – 34), Jesus challenged his followers to live each day fully and not be afraid. Every time we are tempted to give in to fear we need to make a conscious choice to respond in trust and openness.
