The parable of the sower is one of the few occasions in Matthew where Jesus gives an explanation of the parable: that the response to Jesus' message, the good news of God's love, is affected by the circumstances of human life. Another implicit message of the parable is God's liberality: he sows widely and even if only some of the seed bears fruit, the harvest is rich enough for all.


